Since those days the boat section has grown, with some boats in the harbour at Folkestone and the rest of the boats launching off the beach at Hythe. The Club sets a high standard of safety with all boats being well equipped with safety equipment.

All-in-all we have competitions to suit everyone, whether it be beach or boat fishing. Flat fish, Cod, Bream, Smoothhound, Ray, Bass, or even sometimes Tope!! We have them all.

We, the Club, trust you will have many years of outstanding fishing and comradeship with us.

Club Constitution

1. The Club will be called the SEABROOK SEA ANGLERS ASSOCIATION.
2. The object of the Association is to obtain greater facilities for the amateur sport of sea angling, further social intercourse amongst members, provide advancements for sea angling, and to increase the importance of Seabrook as a fishing resort for sea anglers and community participation in the same.
3. The Association will consist of a President, Vice President, Chairman, Secretary, Treasurer and Ordinary Members.
4. The business of the association shall be conducted by a Committee with the President, Chairman, Secretary, Associate Secretary and Treasurer as ex officio members; five to form a quorum and shall meet monthly on due notice to discuss business and to pass accounts. The Chairman shall only have a casting vote.
5. The officers and committee shall be elected at the (AGM) Annual General Meeting.
6. Any nominated member not attending three consecutive meetings and failing to give a satisfactory reason for non-attendance shall be liable to suspension and the committee shall have the power to fill the vacancy.
7. Life membership is to be free.
8. Membership of the Club shall be open to anyone regardless of sex, age, disability, ethnicity, nationality, sexual orientation, religion or other beliefs.
9. Association membership shall be limited and regulated by the committee on a non-discriminatory basis.
10. No member shall participate in any benefits of the Association or compete in competitions unless his or her subscriptions for the current year have been paid. The consideration of specimen fish is included in this rule.
- 10a. No member shall by word or action cause SSAA to be brought into disrepute, to do so and after due investigation by the committee, written warning may be given, however rule 11, 11a and 12 precede this rule
11. Any member of the association misconducting himself or herself, or declining to comply with the rules of the association may, after due investigation, be suspended by a majority of the committee. Such members may afterward be expelled by a resolution of a special general meeting, called under rule 12, and his or her subscription and fees forfeited.
- 11a. Members shall have the right to appeal in person to the committee with regards to any decision affecting them, provided that notice of such appeal is submitted to the Club Secretary, in writing within seven days of notification of the decision.

### Club Constitution (cont)

12. A special general meeting may be called by a requisition to the secretary signed by seven members, but no other business shall be transacted at the meeting other than that for which the meeting has been called. All members are to receive seven clear days' notice of such a meeting.
- 12a. A junior member can be present at a SGM but will be unable to vote if it is called under rule 11 of the association constitution.
13. The accounts of the Association shall be audited by two auditors to be appointed at the AGM. A general report shall be sent to each member who is a paid up member by the 25<sup>th</sup> January no later than 31<sup>st</sup> January each year.
14. All surplus income or profits are to be re-invested in the Club. No surpluses or assets will be distributed to members or third parties.
15. Upon dissolution of the Club any remaining assets shall be given or transferred to another registered CASC, a registered charity or the sports governing body.
16. The Annual General Meeting of the Association shall be held not later than the end of November to ensure all attending are paid up members for that year. Any member having any subject to bring forward at a general meeting must give seven clear days' notice in writing to the Secretary.
17. Members having any subject for complaint must submit the same in writing to the Secretary and he or she will bring the matter to the attention of the committee for their consideration.
18. If anything arises which is not provided by these rules the same shall be laid before the committee, for their consideration.

## General Club Rules

1. Any member can win any number of cups during the season.
2. No member shall fish against the Association in any inter-club competition, except in the case of a friendly or charitable competition where the SSAA are exemplifying the club constitution to further social intercourse between other sea angling clubs.
3. All competitions are for members only.
4. Club key holders will be Boat Secretary, Beach Secretary and Club Secretary, and there assistant secretary's only.
5. A spare key to the winch shed can be obtained from Mick's Tackle, or from the Club Secretary, only in in an emergency and for no other reason.
6. No member, unless authorised, may duplicate club keys (TO DO SO MAY INITIATE RULE 11 OF THE S.S.A.A. CONSTITUTION).
7. To qualify for a Club fish record it must be caught in either an official Club competition (Boat or Beach)
  - a) Must be weighed in at the competition's scales.
  - b) The species must be identified and confirmed.
  - c) The Club Record Form must be filled in and signed by the Competition Secretary and an additional Club member, and the claimant.
  - d) This will then go before the committee for inclusion in the Club records.
  - e) In the interest of conservation, weights of fish from boat competitions will be accepted if weighed on Club standard digital scales and photographed whilst at sea. For all fish weighed whilst at sea .25 lb. will be deducted. If no scales are available, fish must be presented to Boat Secretary for verification.
8. All person's/crew launching from fisherman's beach using the club facilities must be fully paid up members of the SSAA.

## Beach Competition Rules

1. Beach boundaries will be determined at the Annual General Meeting.
2. Competitions will start and finish at the stated time, and is left to the honesty of the members to comply with this.
3. Any member deliberately contravening Rule 11 of the Constitution shall, after due deliberation by three or more Committee Members, forfeit any further participation or benefits of the competition in question.
4. Second rod with a trace is allowed, but only one rod and gear can be in use (i.e. in the water at one time). Three Hooks may be used, one of which may be a treble. But only one treble may be include in a trace.
- 4a. If the All Day Open Beach Trophy is fished on the breakwater at Dover two rods may be used but only three hooks in total may be used between them.
5. Competitors' rods must not be handled by anyone but the competitors themselves unless in danger. A member may be permitted to cast for another, provided that relevant facts have been submitted to the commencement of the competition and permission obtained.
6. A member can ask for assistance with gaff or net.
7. Booking in with the beach secretary at the venue to be nominated by them. Booking in for competitions will commence 1 hour prior to the start of the competition.
8. A fine of £1.00 will be levied per fish for any undersized fish brought to the weigh- in.
9. Competitors must weigh- in at the Association hut, Fisherman's Beach, within 30 minutes of the termination of the competition except for peg and zone competitions which will be weigh-in midway between the competition venues.
10. Specimens for Federation Medals must be weighed in, as per N.F.S.A. Rules.
11. The decision of the Committee will be final in all matters regarding competitions.
12. Re-fishing of postponed competitions will be left to the decision of the Competition Secretary, or any three Committee Members.
13. Members taking part on any of the Association competitions must fish inside the stated boundaries. Failure to do so will disqualify the Member for the rest of the season.
14. Mackerel are banned from the weigh-in, with exception of the mixed pairs, when 2 mackerel will be allowed, but other fish will take priority.
15. An optional snowball with fees for same payable at the start of the year shall be paid to the competitor catching the best specimen in competitions.

Beach Competition Rules (cont)

16. The inter-teams competitions shall not count towards Club championships.
17. Christmas Competition results are not applicable to the Club Championship. Lugworm, squid and fish baits only can be used for this competition. Fish caught can be counted towards club trophies.
18. Complaints have to be brought to the attention of a Committee Member no later than 5 minutes after the close of scales.
19. The Competition Secretary has the right to change the venue on the night. All changes to match fixtures, times or type of match are down to the Beach Secretary's discretion.
20. No pre-booking is allowed. If a member is late, they must liaise with a Committee Member on the beach.
21. No fish to be accepted at the scales by any person/member, other than the person/member who caught them.
22. In the interests of conservation, in pegged matches only, and at the discretion of the Beach Secretary, any Lesser Spotted Dogfish [LSD] caught will be entered on the peg card provided if, at the time of capture, a signature and peg no is obtained from the competitor on the next peg. The fish should then be returned to the water and a weight of 1lb per fish will be credited to the captor at the weigh-in.
  - a. In these circumstances LSD's will be excluded from the 'heaviest fish' pool as it is possible many competitors will have the same 1lb heaviest fish.
  - b. It will be left up to the individual to decide if he/she wants to retain an LSD for purposes of Specimen Fish trophy or Club Record fish claim.
  - b. This ruling is not applicable to Smoothounds, Bullhuss or Spurdog.
  - c. 23. In the case of a draw between competitors (equal weights) the following applies
    - i. Number of fish
    - ii. If still equal - the heaviest fish
    - iii. If still equal - number of species
23. Club boundaries are from Pirate Springs to Folkestone Pier Wall.
  - d. Booking-in & weighing in is at the Club Hut at fisherman's beach by 1830 hrs unless otherwise stated.
  - e. Pegged Competition draws 1820 hrs unless otherwise stated.
  - f. All peg/pegs to be brought to the weigh-in or handed to a member who is attending the weigh-in.
25. Christmas and BBQ Competitions do not count toward the Beach Champion Cup.

### Mick's Cash-pot 1 & 2 Competition Rules

1. These shall be fished under normal Seabrook SAA beach rules.
2. The matches, of which there are two, will be selected by Mick and Pauline Sullivan from any of the matches on the beach fixture list that year.
3. The selection will kept secret from all members, sealed in an envelope signed and given to the club secretary for safe keeping.
4. The contents of which matches will be revealed at the club presentation night.
5. The prize fund for each selected match will be £50.00 and will be split 50/50 the overall winner and the heaviest fish of the chosen matches.

### Pairs BBQ Competition Rules

1. The competition will be fished within Club boundaries.
2. No points will be awarded for this competition.
3. Any member wishing to fish on his or her own may do so but will not be eligible for the Shield.
4. Any member who wishes to fish as a pair who has no partner (male/female) may do so after drawing from a name pool.
5. Weigh-in will take place at the B.B.Q. venue.
6. Beach Secretary will nominate one member (adult) to dispose of unwanted fish
7. Optional pools will be available and are open to all members at £4.00 per entrant. G.N.O.F Heaviest Flat Heaviest Round, Sealed Weight.
8. Specimen fish will count towards Specimen Cup.
9. Species of fish count towards the species cup.



### Xmas Cup Pools Qualifying Rule

1. Any member wishing to enter the Xmas Cup Pools must fish no less than 6 qualifying matches during the year - as shown on the beach fixtures list.
2. The fee will be £2.00 per member per qualifying match, in addition to normal fees or optional pools.
3. A separate record will be kept for the Xmas competition and all monies will be held by the Beach Secretary only and no other member of the Association.
4. In exceptional circumstances, i.e. illness, college, etc. a maximum of 2 qualifying matches may be missed. Matches above this figure will have to pay £15.00 before the final entry date. The extra £3.00 will go to the Club funds.
5. Any member who joins the Club late in the year will have the option of paying into the Xmas Pool at the discretion of the Beach Secretary or Committee.
6. Members who wish to pay in advance i.e. the beginning of the year may do so but Rule 4 will apply to those members.
7. Prize-giving will take place at the Presentation Evening each year, and will consist of cash prizes 1<sup>st</sup> to 6<sup>th</sup> places by total weight only.
8. The competitions will be fished in a zoned and pegged area as detailed by the Beach Secretary.
9. Bait will be lugworm, squid and fish baits ONLY.
10. Optional pools will be available at £4.00 per entrant.

10. Junior prizes will be available to those juniors who have not paid into the Xmas Pools, the cost of which to be offset from the Clubs funds.

## Junior Section

All Club rules apply to juniors as well as to adult members. Below are five more rules for the junior section.

### Junior Rules

1. Juniors must fish at all times with parent or a responsible adult. The same applies in zone and club boundary competitions.
2. Juniors may enter adult pools but on doing so they then elect to fish as a senior for the rest of the year, this then excludes them from junior trophies and prizes.
3. Juniors must be under 16 years of age at the 1<sup>st</sup> January (start of Club's New Year). They may fish as a junior at 16 for the remainder of the year.
4. Juniors do not have to qualify to fish the Xmas Competitions as they will be fishing for the junior prizes, unless they have elected to fish as an adult (Rule 2).

## Boat Section Rules

1. No member shall by word or action cause the S.S.A.A. to be brought into disrepute.
2. All boats will carry safety equipment and be seaworthy.
3. Only members to fish boat competitions.
4. One boat shall constitute a competition provided at least two members are fishing.
5. Start and finishing times are as stated on fixture list. Failure to land on the beach by the stated time could result in disqualification of those aboard (for that competition only).
6. A minimum of two members per boat, one member to fish at the discretion of the Competition Secretary and the following are to be strictly adhered to:-
  - a) Boats must travel and anchor alongside each other.
  - b) A life jacket or similar must be worn at all times.
  - c) Members must have a working radio or mobile phone and frequently make his/her well-being known.
7. In doubtful weather, boat skippers to contact Boat Secretary prior to competition. Either the even before or on the morning of the competition once sea conditions have been assessed for safety.
8. The championship will be decided by a points system. Weights and sizes will be used in other competitions. Minimum fish sizes are displayed in Club hut.
9. The All Day Cup will be decided by total points
10. A fish caught on any Club competition is eligible for the Specimen award.
11. Boat pairs and teams of four shall be decided at a random draw and best six results to count. If after four competitions members have not made an appearance, those affected will be re-drawn.
12. All members are to book in 1 hour before competition.
13. Any fish brought to the scales undersize will be fined £1.00 per fish to go to the Club.

### Boat Section rules (cont)

14. No boat is permitted to fish within 25yds of any other. This allows the boat to re-anchor if it needs to re-position over a wreck or mark, unless Rule 6 applies.
15. Competitions will be decided on a point's basis except for Cod, Conger, Bass and Black Bream which will be decided by the heaviest weight. Species Cups will be decided on the most species caught over the year. Best of Species will be decided on a percentage of the NFSA specimen weight.
16. In an effort to help conservation of fish stocks, all boat competitions will be fished on a points basis using the peg card system – only the heaviest fish of each species to be brought to scales; every effort to be made to return fish alive at the time of capture and, to this end, Club fines have been implemented.
17. Specimen Cup - species such as Wrasse, Gurnard, Mullet and Rays, must be verified by Boat Secretary and another committee member. Any disputes to be made in writing to the committee with photo attached.
18. For all fish that score one point, only six fish of that species may be submitted in the competition. Also, for unclassified fish, only six each of any species may be submitted.
19. Competition starting time printed is the time boats leave the beach or harbour. If more than one boat is launching from Hythe beach, boats launch earlier but wait 50yds of shore until the start time.  
Competition end time is time on the beach or inside east end of the harbour. Boat Secretary to be contacted with weight in results with in on hour of competition end.
20. Any member who wishes to use the club winch facilities to launch and retrieve, be they the owner or crew must contact the boat secretary to arrange a familiarisation/training period.

It should be boat owner's responsibility to carry a minimum of £2 million public liability insurance to cover injury to persons or damage to property not being part of the club whilst members are using SSAA equipment on Hythe beach.
